Using his recognition skills Hanson was able to locate and match the flashcards that looked the same. While looking at the flashcards Miss Briohny explained to the children about what some of the countries were that the children came from, for example Canadian Mounties which are from Canada, the Aboriginal Children and the little girl from Hawaii. We also finished our Harmony day craft activity this morning. Using orange paint Miss Briohny covered Keaston's hand so he could press it onto the map of Australia we had. The map incorporates each of the children in the Seahorse room.

EASTER SENSORY TABLE




