Easter Art

Today we started our Easter art work using shaving foam, food colouring and white paper. We starting by placing shaving foam into a tray and the children then picked what colours they wanted and mixed it all around. We placed paper on top and made sure we tapped on the top of the paper. Mixing the shaving foam around with a spoon made different pattens that we used to crate our colourfully easter eggs.
