

# STINGRAY DAILY STORY

# OUTDOOR



It was cold outside this morning but it did not bother the children as they kept themselves busy. Spencer, Yoonu, Keaston and Mikayla took turns riding the bikes around the yard. Keaston and Yoonu also spent some time playing in the sandpit. Yoonu used the excavator to dig up the sand while Keaston dug in the sand using the large shovel. Over with the blocks Mikayla and Spencer worked together with Miss Hannah to connect the blocks together. Mikayla used her recognition skills to identify the different colours.



# STRING ART



For arts & crafts today, the stingrays engaged in some string art. Miss Taylor dipped 4 separate strings into 4 different colours, purple, green, blue and black. The children then grabbed the string and wriggled it around on their papers to make their unique masterpieces. This activity was slightly messy as the paint got on their hands, however Spencer and Yoonu decided to improvise and paint their handprint on their piece of paper. The children were all very clever as they have an incredible ability to recognise and state each of the colours of the paint.

# INDOOR



Some of the children engaged this morning with the flower matching activity. Looking through the flowers on the table they worked to select the flowers that matched the outline on their card. Working with problem solving and determination they lined each flower up with the outline to determine if they matched together. They continued to do so until they had matched each flower.



The children expressed their creativity this morning as they worked with the playdough. To extend their interest we added paddle pop sticks to the play. Using their fine motor skills they rolled the playdough out before adding some of the paddle pop sticks. Hanson and Mikayla also decided they were going to add some of the home corner materials to the playdough. They did a great job resourcing their own play.



# GROUP TIME



We have decided to do ongoing learning on the topic of teaching children ways of looking after our environment. Miss Taylor lead group time today on the mat and read a book called “The Messy Magpie”. The moral of the story was that humans should refrain from leaving rubbish lying around as it can negatively impact animals habitats, streams of water and the greenery of forests, and that if humans put in the effort of practicing sustainability and disposing of rubbish away in the right bins, then our environment will flourish. The children pointed out the rubbish truck in the book and the amount of litter scattered everywhere. They felt sympathy for the magpie and other animals in the book as their homes were destroyed by the litter the human beings have caused. This was a simple lesson for children to refrain from littering.
