RAINBOW FISH RECYCLED COLLAGE

To start the children used one of the paint brushes to put glue over their fish before looking through the tray. They then decided if they wanted to use news paper, magazines, brown paper or cellophane to create their fish. Taking their time they placed the pieces on as scales to form the design of their fish. Once they are finished we are doing to place on some pieces of Alfoil to complete the design.

OCEAN CLEAN UP





MUSIC

Today they started by recapping on what they have learnt, from clapping their hands, stamping their feet and making the 'stttt' sound with their mouth. Once they had remembered that they learnt they put it to practice with different songs. They also showed their dancing moves when it came to free dance time. OCEAN PLAYDOUGH MATS



Playdough today and ocean mats. Using the playdough Miss Briohny, Miss Stacey and the children made some different sea creatures to go on their ocean mats. Using their fine motor skills they were able to strengthen their muscles as they rolled the playdough along the table moulding it into different shapes. Spencer showed Miss Briohny the crab he had made.

This activity encouraged the children to use their imagination and creativity as they manipulated the playdough into different shapes.



GROUP TIME

During group time this morning we read 'Ori's Clean-up'. Which is all about an octopus who noticed that his home was full of rubbish and he encouraged his friends to clean it up. While cleaning up the rubbish they realised they could re-use some pieces and out others in the rubbish as well as donating old books that they no longer read anymore. While reading the story Miss Briohny asked the children if it is nice to put our rubbish in the bin and where we should put it instead. The children announced in the rubbish. To finish group time we played a game where we had to move around like different sea creatures. Miss Briohny would ask the children to recognise the animal before showing them to do the different actions.
