PADDLE POP STICK COLLAGE



Today we continued creating our recycled collages by using paddle pop sticks. Selecting one of the paint brushes the children chose between putting glue on the back of the paddle pop sticks or on the paper. Once they had covered the paddle pop sticks they pressed them on to the paper. Using the paddle pop sticks the children created their own unique designs. This activity allowed the children to strengthen their fine motor skills while also expressing their creativity through different media.

INDOOR PLAY

They were different colours such as pink, blue, purple, yellow, white, and had different textures of hair that was a sensory-like experience for the children. Spencer also attempted to set up the barn for the ponies but needed some assistance from an educator. Knowing that my little ponies are considered a toy for girls, the stingray boys like Thomas, Spencer, Hanson, Nate and Samik broke the stereotype by also engaging in play with the my little ponies.




