OUTDOOR



DRAGON BOAT PAINTING



Today is the Chinese Dragon Boat festival and to celebrate the children painted their own dragon boats. Using pom poms on pegs, the children dipped them into paint before pressing them across their page. Violet decided she was going to use her pom poms to spread across the page instead of creating dots. By using the pegs and pom poms the children are strengthening their fine motor skills while also developing their hand-eye coordination. Once the dragon boats are dry we will cut them out and add some decorations to turn them into dragons.




BOATS AND PLAYDOUGH



To continue celebrating the Dragon Boat festival the children played with the blue playdough and we added some of the plastic boats. Using the boats, the children pressed them into the playdough and created the pattern of the underside of the boats. We used blue playdough to represent the water in which the boats travel. The children enjoyed using the playdough, moulding it with their fingers into different designs. Violet discovered that she could roll a piece of playdough between her fingers and it would become skinny, while Thomas pulled off small pieces of playdough and spread them around the table. The playdough is a great way for the children to develop their fine motor skills and control.



PLANE SPOTTING



While outside Miss Briohny set up a mat on the playground with a couple of cushions and laid down with the children, looking up into the sky. As we laid quietly we were able to hear the approach of a helicopter and a couple of planes. The children were so excited to watch them fly over the playground that they had to climb onto the bench to continue watching the helicopter. To continue the children's interest we will start our topic of planes tomorrow.

SELF HELP

Mikayla and Spencer helped Miss Briohny to clean up the tables outside this morning. Using one baby wipe each they worked together to clean the playdough off the mirror table. Once they were sure the mirror was clean they started cleaning the picnic table, wiping over the top, the benches and the two chairs we added. 





Reflection of the day
